The leading fleet was hit by a fast-moving vicious storm Sunday in Green Bay – 50+ knot winds, some hail, lightning, and even waterspouts. Takedown-2 was knocked back from the leaders and suffered damage to a jib but persevered and was soon back racing. The rest of the fleet in Lake Michigan faired a little better as the storm lessened, but still took a beating. The KYC showed up and did well. Six boats: *Takedown-2* (Ron Otto), *Joan Claire* (Jim Pappas), *Sirocco* (Doug Vaccarello), *Lizard* (Eric Routman), *Ace's Dream* (Brian



Hettrick), and *Northern Wind* (Matt Berg) all competed in this year's race. <u>Takedown-2</u> finished 2nd in the division. <u>Joan Claire</u> finished 2nd in her division, once again besting her yellow nemesis.

Speaking of the yellow nemesis, **Doug Vaccarello** was recognized for finishing 36 of the 40 Hook races. In many of those, **Sirocco** placed 1st or 2nd in the division, and one year took 1st Place Overall. Outstanding.
